

VISA AND OTHER REQUIREMENTS TO ENTRY IN ECUADOR

1. PASSPORT VALIDITY: 6 months.

2. BLANK PASSPORT PAGES: 1 page per stamp.

3. VISA REQUIREMENTS

According to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Human Mobility of Ecuador, citizens from the following countries need a visa to entry in Ecuador: Citizens of Afghanistan, Albania, Angola, Bangladesh, Cameroon, Congo (Democratic Republic), Cuba, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Filipinas, Gambia, Ghana, Guinea, Haiti, India, Iran, Iraq, Libya, Kenya, Nepal, Nigeria, North Korea (Democratic Popular Republic of Korea), Pakistan, Senegal, Sri Lanka, Syria, Somalia, Venezuela, Mali, Ivory Coast, Yemen, Tajikistan, Uzbekistan, and Myanmar require a visa to enter Ecuador.

The types of available Non-Immigrant Visas, with their respective requirements, subject to admission, validity of visas, fees and requirements for renewal, can be found below. Foreigners must submit and comply with all required documentation, without exception, in order to choose one of the immigration categories.

Citizens from other countries don't need VISA for stays less than 90 days in any 12-month period for tourism.

4. CURRENCY RESTRICTIONS FOR ENTRY

Travelers must declare currency in amounts greater than \$10,000.

5. CURRENCY RESTRICTIONS FOR EXIT

There is a 5 percent tax on currency taken out of Ecuador above \$1200.00.

6. VACCINATION

Vaccination against yellow fever is recommended for all travelers (national and international) who include in their travel itinerary or who reside in the provinces of the Ecuadorian Amazon (Napo, Pastaza, Orellana, Sucumbíos, Zamora Chinchipe and Morona Santiago); as well as our national travelers who visit / from countries with active outbreaks of yellow fever, such as: Brazil, the Democratic Republic of the Congo and Uganda. It is worth mentioning that travelers visiting these countries must present their international vaccination certificate in accordance with the regulations of the International Health Regulations-RSI. The vaccination guidelines are aimed at all travelers, regardless of their immigration/administrative status (diplomatic, refugee, repatriated, among others).
